Protecting Forests, Preserving Traditions

Villagers are stepping up as dedicated forest stewards. The project is strengthening local forest governance by promoting traditional regulations and establishing professional village forest patrol teams.

Through a community-led planning process, villagers identify seasonal threats, map out patrol routes, and create quarterly patrol schedules tailored to their forest closure areas.



Building Partnerships

This transparent, collaborative approach on forest protection is helping build trust between communities and forest rangers - laying the foundation for a strong partnership focused on restoring and safeguarding forest ecosystems for generations to come.

Increased awareness among many communities is visible, creating a strong foundation for long-lasting training impacts even for the time after the project closure.

Promoting inter-village entrepreneurship

With seed money and funding for income-generating activities (IGAs), Self-Help Groups (SHGs) under the Project are now producing marketable surpluses. This marks a significant step forward in strengthening rural livelihoods and promoting grassroots entrepreneurship.

To take this progress further, the Project is planning to federate SHGs at the cluster level, enabling them to aggregate their produce and create greater market volume. This will not only improve their bargaining power but also open up better opportunities for market linkage.

Building entrepreneurs

A Value Chain Development training brought together project beneficiaries and experts from MOMA, VDVK, and Manipur Forest Department to identify opportunities on Food Processing and Non-Timber Forest Products.

Practical insights on branding, packaging, and marketing were shared by Manipur University and Sana Foods, equipping villagers with tools to grow and sustain their enterprises.

An inspiring session with a successful local entrepreneur highlighted real-world challenges and success strategies.
